Donations to OR-ASTA Annual Fund: Mid-Year Report

On July 1, 2024, OR-ASTA's new board launched its first ever Annual Fundraising Campaign. The purpose of this new endeavor is to allow OR-ASTA to sustain and enhance its gift-giving to benefit Oregon's young string students. These gifts include offering more quality summer scholarships at increased levels for talented students in need; providing grants to community string education projects like the Southern Oregon Strings Festival held in October 2024 in Grants Pass; increasing the amount of award money given to winners of the biennial Solo String Competition (November 2024); and more.

As of today, OR-ASTA has received contributions of money and in-kind support totaling more than \$3,000 from a number of sources. Our highest level **PLATINUM** donor this year is **Kennedy Violins** of Vancouver, who contributed more than \$1,500 in cash and in-kind support. **GOLD** donors included a \$500 gift from Portland-based **David Kerr Violins** and a \$500 gift from an anonymous donor; and contributions and in-kind assistance from wide-ranging **BRONZE** donors including **Holst Violins** in Grants Pass, **Beacock Music** and **Nothing Bundt Cakes** in SW Washington, the **Oregon Viola Society**, **Mark Moreland Violins**, and in-kind support and anonymous donations from ASTA members.

This was a really fun day for our Southern Oregon Orchestras. There were about 110 sting players in attendance along with our special guests the Akhtamar Quartet from Belgium. Each orchestra had a short performance including an on-stage clinic with the Akhtamar Quartet members. The Quartet performed a concert for us playing 3 miniatures for string quartet by Komitas, called Al Aylughs, Yerkinkn Ampel e, and Kagavik; the Bruckner string quintet including Arnaud Ghillebaert; and ended with the 4th movement of Kenji Bunch's String Circle for string quintet. Had a fun pizza lunch all together and then finished our day with a full-group Halloween-themed piece: "The Evil Eye and the Hideous Heart" by Alan Lee Silva based on the Edgar Allen Poe short story, "The Tell Tale Heart".

Some comments by students:



The quartet's ability to bring both precision and emotion to the music was remarkable, as they skillfully combined technical mastery with expressive depth. This fall festival was not only a festival but a journey into the power of live music, leaving a lasting impression on me. My experience with the Belgium string quartet was a profound reminder of the beautyand power of chamber music. This event allowed me to witness the artistry, discipline, and emotional depth that define the best musical performances. The quartet's ability to bring together tradition and innovation made the Fall Festival a memorable cultural experience, one that will stay with me long after the final note has faded."

"I thought their performance was very interesting and it was really cool how they all complimented each other with their music and I could see they would all look at each other throughout the music to make sure they were on time and were with each other. We forget to do that in our orchestra. We are all so focused on ourselves and getting the pieces right that we forget to listen to the other sections and try to play with them."

"Being one who has a generally challenging time staying focused for the entirety of concerts/plays, I found myself pleasantly engaged the entire performance. The pieces the quartet played were beautiful, and they brought so much personality to the songs. They had a very clear passion for their instruments and the pieces they were playing. It made the experience a lot more enjoyable. Something that particularly caught my attention was the piece Kagavik. They played it in their own special way, and it was a very uplifting sound. I found myself tapping my foot throughout the concert as all the pieces were so catchy and enjoyable. I would certainly go out of my way to see them perform again. In all honesty, I've seen orchestra performances by other quartets in the past, but none of them left such a lasting impression on me. I will remember this experience for quite a while. I also admired the fact that all of their outfits had the same pattern in some sort."


